

The U.S. Embassy in Beirut has announced the **2023-2024 Global Undergraduate Exchange program**. This is a one academic semester program in the United States for students between 18 and 25 years. Students will enroll in a full-time, **non-degree**, undergraduate course work in addition to engaging in cultural activities and community service. The program will start in either August 2023 or January 2024 and the deadline to apply is: **December 15, 2022**. Program information and application instructions/link are available [here](#).

- **Study of the U.S. Institutes (SUSI) for Global Student Leaders on Religious Diversity and Democracy:** This program is geared towards undergraduate students aged 18 to 25 who are interested in exploring interfaith dialogue and religious pluralism in the United States. The program will take place from June to early August 2023. The deadline to submit applications is **December 31, 2022**. - **Study of the U.S. Institutes (SUSI) for Young Women Leaders:** This program is for **female** undergraduate students aged 18 to 25 who are interested in developing their advocacy skills and learning about women leadership and role in the society. The program will take place from June to early August 2023. The deadline to submit applications is **December 31, 2022**. As with all U.S. Embassy-sponsored programs, the U.S. Government pays for **all** major expenses, including roundtrip airfare, shared accommodation during the program, meals and health insurance. Competition is merit-based and Lebanese and long-term Palestinian residents in Lebanon from all backgrounds are encouraged to apply. Applicants will be considered without regard to race, religion, sex, age, and/or physical impairment.
